The Lord's Prayer




Matthew 6:9-13



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
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**9. After this manner
therefore pray ye:
Our Father
Which art in heaven.
Hallowed be thy name.**

KEY: The Lord's Prayer is a guide for PRAYER. We pray to "our" Father (showing our personal relationship with Him). We remember God is in heaven (eternal and almighty) and we begin our time in prayer with PRAISE and honor to Him.

**11. Give us this day
our daily bread.**

KEY: God is our Provider and He is our Almighty Source of Provision for our needs. Jesus taught us to ask our Heavenly Father to simply provide for our specific day-by-day needs. This verse also shows how God desires for us let our needs be made known to Him in prayer every day.

**13. And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil,
for Thine is the kingdom and the
power and the glory forever. Amen.**

KEY: Each day, we seek God's direction to stay away from temptation and to protect ourselves and our families from evil. We focus our prayer with worship, not just singing, but acknowledging God's glory and almighty power. Amen is an ending which means, "Yes, I believe it!"

**10. Thy kingdom come.
Thy will be done,
In earth as it is in heaven.**

KEY: God wants for His kingdom (His purposes and His truth and His ways) to come on this earth. In faith, we proclaim in prayer for God's kingdom to "COME!!!" and for His will to be "DONE!!!" (in our personal life, family, church, local area, region, nation, and in the whole world).

**12. And forgive us our debts,
As we forgive our debtors.**

KEY: Seeking God's forgiveness from sin and our debts (for the penalty for these wrong doings) is a part of daily prayer. We need God's forgiveness (through the cross of Jesus) and we need to forgive others, which God will continually help us to do through His grace.

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
